As a result the AIA has had to increase attention on builders in regards to damage to our Right-of-Way and roads, material spills, speeding, and numerous problems with subcontractors. The AIA must be ever vigilant to ensure our community standards are met and assure those that purchase property here that our Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions (CC&R's), which are

part of the property purchase, will be obeyed.

Early last year our Architectural Control Committee (ACC) asked for the Board's guidance on various issues of on-going non-compliances, including fencing, detached garages, unauthorized structures, etc. The Board is in total agreement that the concept of fair and equal compliance dictates *every* property owner adhere to the CC&R's they agreed to with the purchase of their lot(s) and will support the ACC to achieve this goal.

I would like to recap here two major issues before the Board that will need to be resolved within the early

part of this new year.

The first is fairly simple: a Ballot was mailed last year concerning the opportunity to save the AIA precious funds by agreeing to use regular mail instead of Certified mail for the Annual Meeting Notice. I am asking for your help in returning that Ballot so that we may create those savings in the operations of this community.

The second is a major issue that surfaced last year concerned damage to the community Right-Of-Way (ROW). As a result the Board has considered a formal ROW policy to be published in the next couple of months. This policy is being formed as a result of information gathered via a survey mailed to all our property owners last year and includes facts about parking on the ROW, possible damage that results and the costs of that damage to the Association. This policy has been the topic of discussion in several past AIA meetings. The Board would like everyone's input on this policy; it is thus important that each property owner take the time to review, fill out, and return the form. As a private road community, we are all responsible for the repair and maintenance of our roads and need to consider how best to manage them.

For example, one particular incident occurred recently as a female resident was jogging by a home under construction with her two children. The workmen at the construction site started whistling, yelling and making inappropriate gestures as she jogged by. The incident was observed by another resident who reported it to the Board.

The AIA Board contacted the builder who, after verifying the incident with other personnel on the job at the time, took immediate action


folks that prefer to read messages for a time and not post their own until they feel comfortable with the medium. Now, after having been available for about 3 months, there are 23 registered users, with a total of 100 articles! Some of the more popular areas of discussion are the "Good Eats" reports, "Builder & Construction Issues", and of course the "General" catch-all forum where topics range from cable & phone service to scorpions!

Another helpful feature of this forum is the ability to send a "private message" or PM to another user should you rather keep your reply/discussion private. A PM written on the forum will automatically

generate a note to the email address the user supplied upon registering. This note will advise the user there is an email awaiting in his/her password protected "Profile" section for retrieval. (Note: these PM's are not accessible to any other user than the specified recipient...not even to the forum Admin).

Users may browse the Forum without registering, but will have to register in order to post messages or use any of the forum's features.
